# I-Read

## Summer Reading Program

### Eligibility

The program is open to students, grades K – 12.

### Prizes

Special prizes will be awarded in three categories: Super Reader, Most Books Read and Most Reading Points.

### **Super Reader** (combination of books read and reading points)

- XBOX or Playstation, Amusement Park Tickets and other goodies

### **Most Books Read**

- XBOX or Playstation

### **Most Points**

- First Place - XBOX or Playstation
- Second Place – Wii
- Third Place – Bike and Helmet

## I-Read

The I-Read Summer Reading Program is designed to encourage school aged children to read during their summer vacation for the fun of it, use the library and develop the habit of reading. Numerous studies have shown that summer reading programs help ensure that school children retain reading and learning skills over the summer recess. The I-Read Program encourages participants to develop a love of reading.

## How it Works!

For every book read, the reader completes a book review form and or online book report. For every review and report submitted, the reader earns prize points. The individual who reads the most books or accumulates the most book points will be eligible to win a grand prize at the end of the summer. Special prizes will be awarded in three categories: Super Reader, Most Books Read and Most Reading Points. General prizes will be awarded to all students that meet the minimum reading program requirement (six (6) books). The more you read the more chances you have to win!
